

Biographical note: Shouyong Shi

Shouyong Shi has been a professor at the University of Toronto since 2002. He has also taught at the University of Indiana, Queen's University, and the University of Windsor. He has held a visiting post at the University of Pennsylvania and has been a visiting scholar at the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago.

Professor Shi is an internationally renowned economist who has published widely in the areas of macroeconomics, monetary theory, and labour theory, and has spoken at numerous conferences around the world. He is a member of the Society for Economic Dynamics, and the American Economic Association. He is currently a co-editor of the *Annals of Economics and Finance* and was the associate editor of the *Journal of International Economics* from 2000 to 2002.

He has received a number of awards and grants, including the Bank of Canada Fellowship Award, the Queen's University Departmental Award for Excellence, the John Rae prize from the Canadian Economics Association for excellence in research, the University of Windsor Research Board Grant, and grants from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada.

Professor Shi, a native of Tianmen County, People's Republic of China, received a bachelor's degree (1984) in industrial engineering and management science from the Huazhong University of Science and Technology, China. He moved to Canada in 1986 and received both an MA (1988) and a PhD (1991) in economics from the University of Toronto.
