

Biographical note: Henry E. Siu

Henry E. Siu has been an assistant professor at the University of British Columbia since 2002.

Professor Siu is known for his work in macroeconomics. He has published in the area of monetary policy in the *Journal of Monetary Economics*, the *Journal of Economic Theory*, and the *International Economic Review*. He has been a visiting scholar at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis and the Bank of Canada and is currently on the editorial board of the *Canadian Journal of Economics*.

He has received several awards and grants, including Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada grants; scholarships, a fellowship, the Weinberg College of Arts and Sciences Outstanding Graduate Student Teaching Award, and the Department of Economics Distinguished Teaching Award from Northwestern University; the Joseph A. Crumb Prize in Economics, and the Hector Gordon Munro Scholarship in Economics from the University of British Columbia.

Professor Siu received a bachelor's degree in economics with first-class honours from the University of British Columbia (1996) and a PhD in economics from Northwestern University in Illinois (2002).
