Hafedh Bouakez has been an assistant professor at HEC Montréal and, since 2008, an associate professor at the Institute of Applied Economics, HEC Montréal. He has also worked in the International Department at the Bank of Canada.

Professor Bouakez is known for his work in macroeconomics and international economics. He has published in the areas of monetary policy and exchange rates in the *Journal of Monetary Economics*, the *International Economic Review*, and the *Journal of International Economics*. Professor Bouakez is a native of Tunis, Tunisia, and received a BA in economics from the Université de Tunis III (1994) and both an MA (1997) and a PhD (2003) in economics from the Université de Montréal.
