

Biographical note: Michael B. Devereux

Michael B. Devereux has been a professor at the University of British Columbia since 1992. He has taught at the University of Toronto and Queen's University, and has held visiting posts at University College, Dublin; the Chinese University of Hong Kong; and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.

Professor Devereux is known for his work in international economics. He has made frequent visits to central banks and international organizations, including the International Monetary Fund, the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta, the Hong Kong Institute for Monetary Research, the Hong Kong Monetary Authority, and the Deutsche Bundesbank in Germany.

He has published widely in the areas of international macroeconomics, exchange rates, and monetary policy, and has spoken at numerous seminars and conferences around the world. He was co-editor of the *Canadian Journal of Economics* from 1994 to 1998, co-editor of the *Journal of International Economics* from 1999 to 2004, and an associate editor for various other economic journals. He is currently associate editor of the *International Journal of Central Banking*.

Professor Devereux has received a number of awards and grants, including the Bank of Canada Fellowship Award, several Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada grants, the Killam Research Fellowship, two UBC Hampton Research Grants, and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology Direct Grant.

Professor Devereux is a native of Dublin, Ireland, and received both a BA (1977) and an MA (1980) in economics from University College, Dublin. He moved to Canada in 1981 and received a PhD in economics from Queen's University in 1985.
