1. I am Canada's first Prime Minister.
2. My Blackfoot name means "Many Guns" and I became a senator before I had the right to vote.
3. As the first woman elected to the House of Commons, I championed equality and human rights.
4. As a Father of Confederation, I worked to protect French Canada and other minorities.
5. I am an arrow sash, an important symbol of Métis culture.
6. I am an arch in Parliament Hill's Memorial Chamber, which honours Canadian soldiers who have given their lives in service to their country.
7. I am the official Canada150 logo.
8. We are a well-known Canadian symbol. Linked together, we represent Canada's 13 provinces and territories.

1. I am used to make bread and am one of Canada's most important crops.
2. I was created by Kenojuak Ashevak, an Inuit artist from Nunavut who helped introduce Inuit art to the world.
3. I am the Coat of Arms, an official symbol of Canada.
4. My rocky shores in Newfoundland and Labrador may have been where famous explorer John Cabot first reached North America in 1497.
5. I am Wood Buffalo, Canada's largest national park and one of the best places in the world to see the northern lights.
6. I represent Canada's forests, rivers and the Canadian Shield, ancient rock that covers about half of Canada.
7. I am located in British Columbia. I can be called either *The Lions* or *The Twin Sisters*.
