OTTAWA, ONTARIO — The Bank of Canada is pleased to announce this year's recipients of its Scholarship and Work Placement Program for Indigenous students and students with disabilities. The program reflects the Bank's commitment to the diversity of people, ideas and disciplines by encouraging young Canadians to consider employment in fields related to the work of the central bank and assisting them in furthering their education.

The four successful applicants in 2017–18 are as follows:

- Peter Brown, a fourth-year student, pursuing a double major in economics and global politics at Carleton University
- Ellen Lambie Hamilton, a first-year communications student at Royal Roads University
- Barton Loutit, a third-year student at Mount Royal University, pursuing a double major in business administration and finance and accounting
- Michael Weatherford, a first-year information technology student at the University of Ontario Institute of Technology.

- The program awards a scholarship of \$4,000 per year, renewable for up to four years, for tuition costs. Recipients have the opportunity to participate in a paid summer or part-time work placement at the Bank of Canada.
