The Bank of Canada marked International Women's Day by announcing the 2018-2019 recipients of its Master's Scholarship Award for Women in Economics and Finance. This award, first <u>announced in September 2017</u>, is designed to attract and advance women in the core areas of the Bank's work, where they are under-represented. A \$10,000 scholarship is combined with the opportunity for permanent employment at the Bank upon successful completion of a master's degree by a recipient.

The successful applicants in 2018–19 are as follows:

- Chen Fan, completing a Master of Finance at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Sloan School of Management.
- Vivian Chu, completing a Master of Arts in Economics at Queen's University.
- Stephanie Renaud, pursuing a Master of Arts in Economics at Queen's University.
- Sanjana Bhatnagar, pursuing a Master of Arts in Economics at Queen's University.

 Recipients must be enrolled or accepted in a master's degree program in economics or finance, and self-identify as a woman. Work-placement opportunities are determined based on the recipient's field of study.
